
# **Encourage & Equip**

## Viaţa în Familie (Family life)

"So where are you living?" is a common question we receive. At the moment we are living with Adi's parents. Whilst six people living in a 2-bedroom apartment sounds tight, we all believe it is possible and will help us to save money to build a home on the block of land we were able to purchase while in Australia. Adi's parents enjoy having us here and we can all help each other in various ways. Neither of Adi's parents are believers, so it is our prayer that we can be a witness to them and point them to Jesus.

Anna's outgoing nature has certainly not died down since arriving. She regularly talks to people in our stairwell, in the park, at church and even in the supermarket, leaving me to translate and explain why a 3 ½ yr old is randomly talking to them in English. She is picking up Romanian slowly and to her delight she has learned important words such as 'ciocolata' (chocolate) and 'ingetata' (ice-ceam). Even though illness delayed her attendance at preschool, she is eager to attend. Her teacher is very understanding and speaks

English but has noted that interacting with the other children has been challenging and her attention span is very limited when they have group time in Romanian. We are thankful that despite these challenges she remains positive, enthusiastic and is eager to make friends.

Luca is his charming self, smiling at strangers and waving his tiny hand to the delight of onlookers. Since there is no communication barrier with him, people happily babble away with him and enjoy his hugs. He is slowly adjusting to Romanian food, with fresh raspberries being his current favourite.

### Reconnecting, new relationships & opportunities

We were both eager to travel to Socodor, a small town 100kms north of Timisoara, to see Adi's cousins and reconnect with Beni, who leads the children's ministry at the local church (who a lot of you met on the video we presented). We were able to attend their first kids program for the new school year and whilst the numbers where small, it was a great joy to see the leaders faithfully continuing to share the gospel with children in their church and community.

We have greatly appreciated being part of the ECM family in Australia and it is a great joy to now be a part of the ECM family in Romania also. We have a French colleague, Alexia, here in Timisoara, who started up Casa Mitspa, a home for at risk mothers and their children. We are looking forward to regularly meeting with Alexia for prayer, fellowship and accountability.

One of our primary aims in this first year is connecting with existing children's ministry organisations to see what is already being done and how we might partner with them. With the school year having just commenced, we already have opportunities to attend two children's ministry conferences in the coming month, which we are very excited about. Please pray that God would give us open eyes to see how He is at work, for encouraging relationships with workers from these organisations and for great wisdom and discernment as to how we could contribute to strengthening children's ministry in Romania.
